Club Hilly TT:

This event was not discussed specifically (although in view of previous problems with agreeing a course, is unlikely to be staged in the usual early months of the year)

Club 10 TTs &

Improving Race Participation and Working with Other Clubs With low entry numbers to the Club's Wednesday evening TTs, AM has followed up on previous Committee discussions and approached other local cycling clubs with a view to sharing organization and broadening appeal with inter-club competitions and prizes

The other local clubs are VCGH (Godalming & Haslemere) and Woking CC. Both have voiced interest. Each club would promote four events using three different courses (Woking use a Chobham course). Our series could be staged on Thursday evening (so that members riding Tuesday evening hills would be more likely to participate) and ideally in mid-summer for maximum daylight hours. The other clubs stage their events on Saturday mornings which also, could be more convenient for our members and add variety

This should be promoted enthusiastically within our club to give the series impetus and success. A trophy could be awarded to the winning club to add competition

Our four events would continue to require two time keepers

We need to ascertain start times and course locations from the other clubs and whether our course can be ridden on a Thursday evening and a Saturday morning AM C'TEE

Open 25 mile TT:

AM commented that we need to ascertain the precise course details as it appears that the course booked with CTT is a London West one, continuing to use the Coxbridge roundabout. This is more hazardous than using a turn at the far end of the course and even more so at the proposed afternoon start time. Enquiries are to be made with Race Secretary Gavin Watson

Road Racing:

Ahead of this Committee meeting Andy Calladine posted that our affiliation to Surrey League has not been renewed but might be, depending on current conversations with VCGH to see if an alternative racing program emerges, that works better for our members. (Previously Torben Vest confirmed our continued affiliation to Cycling Time Trials)

Town Centre Races (TCR)

AB reported:

- Road closures are being applied for including Upper High Street.
 Barriers may be needed to the centre of the High Street for contra flows and to the sides of the High Street
- The Council have concerns regarding numbers of spectators but AB is unsure of expected numbers. Noting the Series event run by Barnsley CC is well attended
- Sigma Sports are increasing their sponsorship and want to erect a gantry. Parcours, Motion and Experience Guildford also are sponsors (the latter with £1,000) but Hamptons have withdrawn because the contact has moved to another regional office
- British Cycling have agreed that the extended course is workable and are making a £3,000 funding contribution in view of our event being one (Southern) leg of the National Series. AB is pressing for nearer £5,000 and seeking Crowd Funding, all with a view to maximising earnings from staging the event. This is necessary in view of the extra expenses, including barriers and prize fund. Entry fees are increased. Regarding barriers, it is possible that Barnsley CC could organise barriers for all the series events with cost savings from "bulk buying"
- Waiting for Parcours to confirm their 3 year commitment
- AB continues to raise funding and the matter is on-going
- A pit area will be required, possibly in the lower part of the High Street as in recent years
- There could be seventy riders in the Elite Race
- The club needs to create its own website for the race, ideally by a member found from our WhatsApp groups, to reduce costs. We could take guidance from the website of Otley CC
